# 15 YEARS OF GIVING

## THE GIVING CONTINUES

Since 2003, the Alaska USA Foundation has been honored to distribute more than \$2 million to help fund community organizations in Alaska, Arizona, California, and Washington. In 2019, with the credit union's assistance, the Foundation was able to contribute 99.5% of its total income, with contributions totaling \$316,480.

## ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY & THEIR FAMILIES

The challenges faced by members of the military and their families while defending our nation are immense. The Alaska USA Foundation donated \$55,000 to help provide a network of support for those who serve.

## CHILDREN

\$155,000 went to non-profits that provide a range of services for children, including medical care, food programs, head-start programs, and financial education.

## VETERANS

By giving \$33,000 to veteran support groups, the Alaska USA Foundation assisted agencies that work to prevent homelessness, help veterans to obtain necessary medical services, and provide legal aid assistance.

## FOOD BANKS & PANTRIES

Hunger is one of the most prominent issues in all of the communities we serve. The Alaska USA Foundation was able to distribute \$73,480 to local food banks and pantries.

With our community partners, our volunteers, and our corporate sponsors, this year has been our most successful year yet. Now we look to next year and the continued drive to increase membership and raise funds for essential community services.
