Through the branches of Alaska USA Federal Credit Union and online donations, the Alaska USA Foundation helps to facilitate donations to local food banks and pantries in 21 unique areas.

2nd Harvest Food Bank supports the local Spokane community through programs and services that provide food 365 days a year. Every \$1 equals 5 meals and approximately 5 pounds of food.

CSUSB assists with their transition to the university environment, helping them achieve academic success, and aiding them in reaching their personal development goals.

The Military has been a part of Alaska USA since its inception in 1948 and fifteen years ago, the Alaska USA Foundation chose to help support organizations that benefit our United States military personnel and their family. Today, the Alaska USA Foundation provides \$60,000 in funding to help support and benefit non-profit organizations who support military service members and their families.

The Armed Services YMCA (ASYMCA) of Alaska helps support military service members and their families through the operation of more than 20 programs and services, which help to alleviate stress, assist with life challenges, and increase the morale and welfare of military personnel and their families.

For 15 years, the Alaska USA Foundation has been providing financial support to organizations with programs that benefit children, veterans, active duty military and their families, and local food banks and pantries. Distributing more than \$2 million since its inception in 2003, the Alaska USA Foundation has been honored to help fund organizations in Alaska, Arizona, California, and Washington. With the credit union's assistance, the Foundation was able to keep operating expenses to less than 1%, allowing it to contribute a total of \$274,400 in 2018.

CHILDREN—Children are the most vulnerable members of society, and one of the primary focuses of charitable giving by the Alaska USA Foundation. This year, \$117,750 went to non-profits that perform a range of services for children, including medical care, food programs, head-start programs, and financial education.

**VETERANS**—As long as individuals continue to make sacrifices for the sake of defending our nation, Alaska USA Foundation will strive to help veterans. This year \$18,750 was given to veteran support agencies that work to prevent homelessness, help veterans obtain medical services, and provide legal aid assistance.

**ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY & THEIR FAMILIES**—The challenges faced by members of the military and their families while defending our nation are immense. The Alaska USA Foundation donated \$60,000 this year, and those funds are used to build more resilient military families, provide services to alleviate stress through a network of support, and provide activities to acknowledge service men and women and their families.

FOOD BANKS & PANTRIES—Hunger is one of the most prominent issues in all of the communities we serve. Through the annual food drive fundraiser, the Alaska USA Foundation was able to collect and distribute \$77,900 to local food banks and pantries to work towards eliminating hunger in our communities.

In the year ahead, the Alaska USA Foundation would like to increase membership, improve awareness, and increase community engagement in order to further the reach of the Foundation's mission. With our community partners, our volunteers, and our corporate sponsors, we know that 2019 will be our most successful year yet.
